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THE RELATIONSHIP OF PARENTING STYLES AND (CHLB) CLEAN AND HEALTHY LIVING BEHAVIOR WITH THE INCIDENCE OF STUNTING IN CHILDREN AGE 0-24 MONTHS <i>(Study in Batonaong Village, Arosbaya District, Bangkalan Regency)</i>	
ABSTRACT <i>Stunting is a chronic nutritional problem caused by a prolonged lack of nutritional intake. The incidence of stunting in 2023 in Arosbaya District, Batonaong Village was 33 with a stunting prevalence of 32.25%. The aim of the research is to determine the relationship between parenting patterns and clean and healthy living behaviors (CHLB) with the incidence of stunting in children.</i> <i>The design of this research is quantitative, using a descriptive analytical research method with a cross-sectional study design. The independent variables are parenting styles and clean and healthy living behaviors (CHLB). Dependent variable: Stunting. Population of 64 toddlers aged 0-24 months, with a sample size of 55 respondents. The sampling was conducted using a probability sample through simple random sampling according to the inclusion and exclusion criteria. The instruments used are questionnaires as well as measuring height (TB) and weight (BB), and the statistical test used is the lambda test.</i> <i>The research results show a significant influence between Parenting Patterns and the Incidence of Stunting in Children Aged 0 – 24 Months. with a p-value of 0.043 and a p-value < α (0.05). And the research results show a significant influence between Clean and Healthy Living Behavior (CHLB) and the Incidence of Stunting in Children Aged 0 – 24 Months. With a p-value of 0.020 and p-value < α (0.05).</i> <i>It is expected that healthcare workers in service facilities can contribute to efforts to prevent stunting in children, which can improve parenting patterns and Clean and Healthy Living Behaviors (CHLB).</i> Keywords: Parenting Styles, CHLB, The Incident of Stunting
