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THE RELATIONSHIP OF THE ROLE OF FAMILY AND THE ROLE OF CADRES WITH THE COMPLETENESS OF BASIC IMMUNIZATION IN TODDLER UNDER 12 - 36 MONTHS <i>(Study in Sembilangan Village Area, Bangkalan District, Bangkalan Regency)</i>	
ABSTRACT Complete basic immunization is the provision of initial immunization to infants to achieve immune levels. However, there are families who do not carry out complete basic immunization due to the lack of family role and the role of cadres in the completeness of basic immunization in children. The purpose of this study is to analyze the relationship between the role of the family and the role of cadres with the completeness of immunization in Sambilangan Village, Bangkalan District. Research design using descriptive analytics with a cross sectional approach. Population 50 families who have toddlers 12-36 months with a sample of 44 respondents with simple random sampling technique. Independent variables in This study is the role of family and the role of cadres. The dependent variable in This research is the completeness of basic immunization in infants 12-36 months. Tool Data collection tools using questionnaires using the Speraman statistical test Rank statistical test (p-value 0.05). This study obtained ethical test No. 2348/KEPK/UNIV-NHM/EC/XII/2024. The results showed the role of the family in supporting the completeness of basic immunization in toddlers 12 - 36 months obtained less than 50% of respondents. The results of research on the role of cadres are in the category of more than 50% quite active. the status of completeness of basic immunization carried out to 44 respondents 47.7% get complete immunization, 52.3% get incomplete immunization. The results of statistical analysis p-value 0.002 (p-value 0.05) r value 0.495 indicates there is a significant relationship strong enough between the role of the family with the completeness of basic immunization in toddlers. Spearman rank test on the role of cadres obtained a p-value of 0.003 (p-value 0.05) with r 0.440 indicates a significant relationship is quite strong between the role of cadres with the completeness of basic immunization in toddlers. Future research is expected to develop the role of the family and support the role of cadres, hoping to be more active, innovative so that mothers are able to bring their children to routine posyandu.
