THE FACTORS THAT INFLUENCE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF TETANUS TOXOID IMMUNIZATION IN PROSPECTIVE BRIDES AND GROOMS <i>(In Karang Penang District, Sampang Regency)</i>	
ABSTRACT <i>Tetanus toxoid (TT) immunization is a vaccination that is useful for providing protection against Clostridium tetani infection. Based on a preliminary study in April 2025, at the KUA Karang Penang Sampang, out of 10 prospective brides and grooms, 80% did not receive premarital TT immunization. This was due to 20% fear of the impact after TT immunization, 20% lacked knowledge about the benefits of TT immunization, and 20% did not receive support from the bride and groom's family. The purpose of this study is to analyze the factors that influence the implementation of tetanus toxoid immunization in prospective brides and grooms in Karang Penang District, Sampang Regency.</i> <i>The research design was an analytical survey with a retrospective approach. The study population was 45 prospective brides and the research sample was 40 prospective brides using a purposive sampling technique. The independent variables were knowledge, commitment of the KUA and support from the prospective bride's family, while the dependent variable was TT immunization. The research instrument used a questionnaire. The analysis used a non-parametric Spearman Rank correlation test. Ethical review by the KEPK team of Noor Huda Mustofa University No.2796/KEPK/UNIV-NHM/EC/VIII/2025.</i> <i>The results of the study showed that most prospective brides and grooms had good knowledge of TT immunization, as many as 16 respondents (59.2%). Meanwhile, the KUA commitment variable showed that most prospective brides and grooms had less KUA commitment by not doing TT immunization, as many as 17 respondents (77.2%), and the family support variable showed that most prospective brides and grooms had good family support for doing TT immunization, as many as 15 respondents (53.5%).</i> <i>KUA should play an active role in supporting the tetanus toxoid (TT) immunization program, especially for prospective bride women. One form of this role is to make TT immunization a mandatory requirement for marriage administration and to record it in the marriage documents. However, the effectiveness of this role still needs to be evaluated to ensure its optimal implementation.</i> Keywords: Tetanus Toxoid Immunization, Knowledge, KUA Commitment, Family Support
